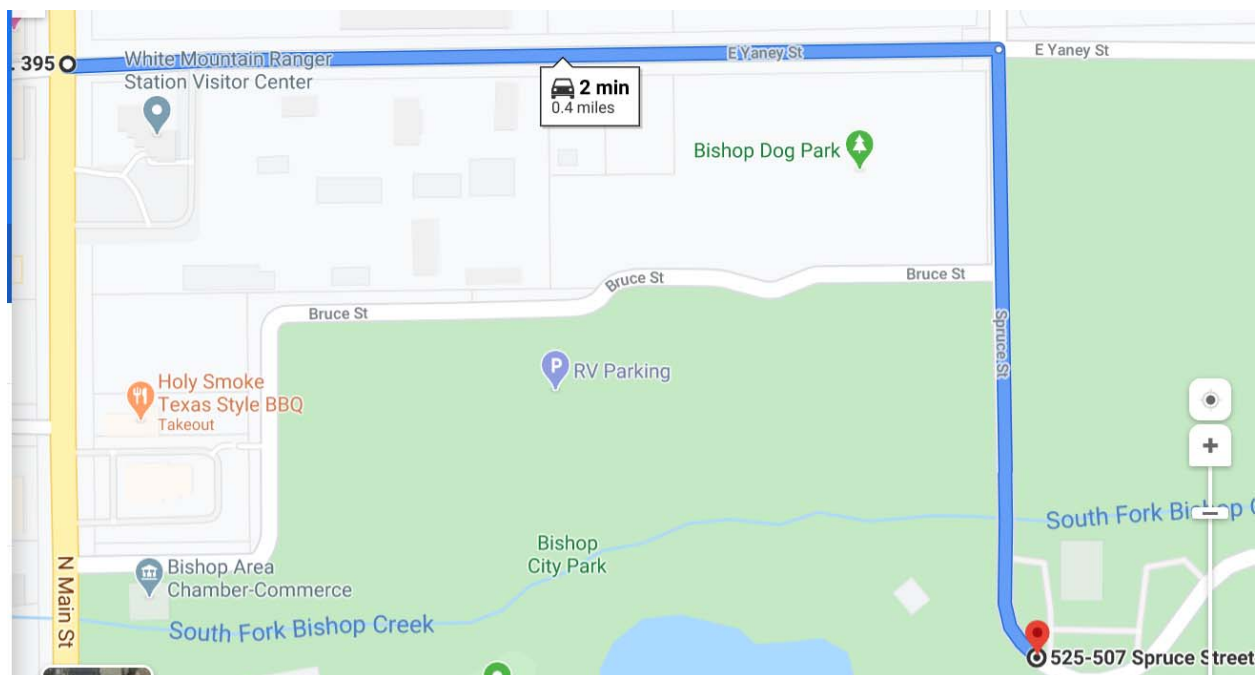


# DSES Site Plan Template for Off Site Sport Sessions

Site Name: [Bishop City Park](#) (back) – 541-527 Spruce Street Bishop, CA 93514 (opposite [Senior Center](#) - 682 Spruce St)

Directions to site (w/ link to maps): [From Highway 395/Main Street](#)

- turn East onto Yaney Street
- turn South onto Spruce Street
- Park in street parking lot near restrooms on south or west side of Spruce Street



Transportation options: POV, ESTA Dial-A-Ride, Carpool

Parking location & accessibility: accessible street parking opposite the Bishop Senior Center. Road and trails are paved. Do NOT park in Senior Center Lot

Bathroom locations & accessibility: accessible parking and restroom at parking area w/ flush toilets

Drinking water availability: sinks in bathroom and outdoor spigot in park. Best to bring own water.

Access to actual sport site (lake shore, dock, trailhead etc.) and accessibility issues & mitigation: No issues for road biking departing from parking lot.

Weather consideration: Spring through Fall temperatures can range from cool days -upper 40-50F to quite hot days in the upper 90s-low 100F. Humidity is quite low and there is often a light breeze and occasional strong wind. Bringing plenty of water, sunscreen, sun hat, and layers is advisable.

Nearest shelter: Covered picnic area ~200m from parking site.

Nearest first aid: Basic first aid & AED pack in DSES truck.

Natural history or other facts of interest:

- Wildlife sightings on these rides can include: bald eagles, red tailed hawks, black tailed jack rabbits, fence lizards, whiptail lizards, horny toads, garter snakes, rattlesnake, road runner, antelope ground squirrel, turkey vultures, great blue heron and more.
- The loop to the north passes by Laws Railroad Museum, a California Historical Landmark which offers a fascinating glimpse into the old west.
- Bishop is the setting for the back story of the movie China Town dealing with the battle with LADWDP over water rights in the Owens Valley.
- The Owens Valley has a rich geologic history which includes active volcanoes (including the largest eruption in history ~760,000 years ago), mining, earthquakes, glaciation, and more.
- Tourism and agriculture are mainstays of the local economy.

  - Nature of Incident
  - Call back number
- Type of emergency and special response actions:
  - Medical Injury/Accident
    - Call 911
    - Secure the scene, make safe to prevent further injury to self or others
    - Comfort victim(s) until help arrives
    - If trained and certified, administer first aid to your level of certification
  - Fire
  - Wind Event
  - Earthquake
- Complete incident report - turn in within 24 hours
